Course Description

Probabilistic modeling of engineering systems and fundamentals of statistical analysis and inference.

Topics to be covered

Probability and Expectation, Discrete and Continuous Random Variables, Joint Distributions, Estimation Methods, Confidence Intervals, Hypothesis Testing, Statistical Inference, and Regression.

To enhance student understanding of the role of uncertainty in engineering analysis; To learn how to design, model and analyze systems subject to risk and uncertainty; To understand the fundamentals of statistical analysis and inference.
